If I were to ask you, “Where were you when the events of September 11, 2001 happened?” your mind would likely recall that horrific day in vivid detail. But if you were around in 1973, do you remember what you were doing on January 22 that year? Probably not.

Forty years ago on that day, seven Supreme Court justices handed down the landmark Roe v. Wade and the less familiar Doe v. Bolton decisions that have resulted in the loss of over 55 million unborn babies’ lives. In York County over the last ten years, a staggering 7,000 lives have been lost due to abortion. Do we feel the same shock and sorrow

that we did on 9/11? Can we fathom the devastation this has caused to countless women and their families?

The number 40 in the Bible is often used in conjunction with a time of testing or probation. So if the last 40 years have been a test of how well we did in doing our part to end abortion, what would our “grade” be?

I fear our pro-life message has often been rejected because of our negative and judgmental tone. I believe that if we are to win the attention and the hearts of those who support the abortion choice, we will win it only with the compassion of Christ.

As we at Human Life Services minister to the women and men who are in desperate situations — many times long before they are facing an unplanned pregnancy — we strive to follow Christ’s example, so beautifully expressed in Isaiah 61:1-3:

*The Spirit of the Lord God is upon me, because the Lord has anointed me to bring good news to the afflicted; He has sent me to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to captives and freedom to prisoners ... to comfort all who mourn ... giving them a garland instead of ashes, the oil of gladness instead of mourning, the mantle of praise instead of a spirit of fainting ... So they will be called “oaks of righteousness, the planting of the Lord, that He may be glorified.*

As we celebrate the gift of Spiritual life in Jesus Christ this Easter season, I hope you’ll join me in a fresh commitment to “pass the test for life”! Thank you for your faithful prayers and financial support!

When “Jenna” first came to Human Life Services she was 18, living in a recovery home, newly sober, and scared beyond belief. She had recently started working part-time at a clothing store, and was working towards her last few credits for a high school diploma. She tells us, “I will never forget how I felt the moment I found out I was pregnant. I had never been so terrified in my life. It was, of course, unplanned, and for a week or so after, I heavily contemplated ending the pregnancy. I knew in my heart that I could not do that, and then it hit me: I’m going to have a baby...” Jenna had just gotten engaged before she found out she was pregnant. Both she and the father of the baby were scared.

Through a friend she began coming to HLS. She says this about HLS, “I had a lot of people telling me I was making a mistake [by not having an abortion], and the staff at HLS made me know I was doing the right thing. I felt brave and strong. My relationship with my family, and also with the father of the baby’s family, was strained, and I felt really alone most of the time. The CARE program gave me a sense of independence and excitement. Slowly, things started coming together.” Jenna graduated from high school, and moved to a “sober” house. Now, she is a full-time college student. Her support system and relationships are better than ever. She has been clean and sober for almost one year. And, she has delivered a beautiful baby boy. It will be exciting to see how God will continue to write the rest of her story!
